If the blocks were cast all at one time they would have joined together.

No. You understood nothing (much likely did not want to).  
It is not possible to cast all the blocks at one time. You have to wait some time (4 hours in case of Davidovits experiment) to pour the next one. Then, there is no fusion between the blocks and the joints get their final look when the surface dries over the following months.

By the way, concrete behaves similarly when one wait between pouring 2 batches.

My impression is that you try to emphasize those secondary questions to wander away from the strong evidences presented in Barsoum's paper. I guess you realize that's typically the behaviour of a crackpot when confronted to solid scientific evidence?
