I haven't kept up to date on what's available, or if there are any better chips than the LM 3909 out there. Ideally it should be able to run for a year and be small enough to be clipped onto the dogs collar without having a honking big battery hanging off it (ideally the thing has to be smaller than the dog, which is pretty tiny). Any suggestions appreciated. TIA.
