I've put stuff like that back together, but it depends on the 'features'.
A simple timed drier is pretty easy, but if it detects moisture or has
other complex features you are probably SOL.

OK what is SOL? I have had a bit of experience with this sort of thing
myself. Its basically got a timer, high/low settings(which is just 1 or 2
elements on) some kind of water sensor gadget and the usual door switches
etc.
