- > I worked for sometimes as an analyst at a large Nickel smelter,
- > (... while attending courses at the Kalgoorlie School of Mines !)

- > I am delighted to have found someone like you, who will understand the
- > extend of the experimentations I have conducted on metal plates, relative to

That is true. You reach a point where it is better to make a casting or to use a drill.

- > All top parts of mountains are RAGGED, and this is not due to Erosion since
- > erosion smoothen features (... with the habitual mechanical erosions
- > Georges has learnt by heart 1/2 a Century ago)
- > All bottom parts of Mountains are SMOOTH with the original crystalline
- > structure, when this is the case, completely metamorphosed to an amorphic
- > structure :

This is true. I had completely missed thinking about that before.

- > ... and as in any Punching Process, instantaneous at that, unless there is
- > a matrix ! ... and in the case of the Earth Lithosphere, the matrix are the
- > borders where it give up.
