Photoshop will rasterise the postscript and I can use this to produce different image sizes and resolutions which I can then export as an .eps file which is ok to open with Freehand.

Use GhostScript instead. It'll take PS to EPS directly (which AIUI is a pretty minor change. Caveat : I don't know enough about PS to assess if I have even a vague understanding of it.) without the intermediate rasterising step, so your EPS will have the vector data of the original PS file from Cornell's GIS.

Any idea how I can open the original .ps file and retain the vector format?
