stayed hidden in dense willow. When I got very close, it just
kept
quiet.

Whatever kind of bird it was, it sure had a beautiful, melodious song. I'm not too familiar with European songbirds, so I couldn't help you identify it. We have a lot of mockingbirds here. One in particular that seems to come back to my yard every year for the past three or four years has learned how to mock eastern blue jays, a truck backing up (beep, beep, beep...), a telephone ringing, and a police siren (woo, woo, woo..). That last one is very funny to hear coming from a bird. I was outside with my grandsons one day and told them about it, and they didn't believe me. But the bird was on cue and started his siren call, and they just thought that was the coolest thing they'd ever heard a bird do. Keep up the good work with the video.

I found out what kind of bird's on the video (local name kær-sanger). It has the same way of imitating other birds, but not as apparantly obnoxious as your mockingbird :o)

Ah yes. A warbler. That makes sense.
