>EDICT currently has entries for ~O< and O<

>r< ~O< (suf,v5r) (1) to turn up; to roll up (e.g., sleeves); (2) verb suffix to indicate reckless abandon to the activity;

>(P)

>r< O< (v5r) to turn over; to turn pages of a book; to tear off; to strip off; (P)

>Examples are currently linked to r< only (e.g. not distinguishing between ~O<

>and O<) however as they are all in hiragana there's no reason why they

>can't be split up.

OK. Done.

>EDICT doesn't have a separate entry for rœ<, but instead

>the automatic verb form thingy refers you to r< indirectly

>implying that it's a potential form but I'm not sure that's

>always correct.
