I do share the scare but I want to point out that adding a dubious argument to a case (like the apparent discrepancy between affiliation registration and voting) only weakens the case. Besides, if one finds fault with procedures that he had accepted initially, he seems to deserve what he 's got (whether ineptitude or duplicity may be suspected).

Therefore only two kinds of cases are sustainable now, imo:  
(1) if someone (like Jimmy Carter) has insisted since before the elections that they did not seem free and fair, and  
(2) if after the election some new fact is learned, like the grossly inefficient encryption scheme that has been described in another message.
