I am not a dentist however, dealing with dental issues for sometime I think it makes sense to see an oral surgeon. In fact it seems like many dentists will refer to an oral surgeon right from the start for an extraction. Ask your dentist to refer you an OS immediately and I would guess (though again I am not a dentist) if the oral surgeron feels there is a severe infection he will recommend further referral to a hospital setting, otherwise he (or she) will complete the extraction themselves! All they do at a hospital anyway is have you attended to by the staff OS.

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
