>the product. The dairy has been shut down. People who drank

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>unpasteurized, or raw, milk from the Dee Creek Farm were  
>asked to contact their health department, whether they were  
>sick or not."

>with seemingly good intentions continuously lull trusting  
>consumers into doing the wrong thing.
