> > > attempt to resist authority.*

> > > *Truth is simple.*

> > *Once again, dear Andrew, you are confusing truth with fact.*

> *For those who can discern the truth, there is no confusing the truth
> with anything.*

And what, pray tell, gives you the ability to discern truth?
