I met Herr Dannenberg when I was at the U.S. Space Academy Level I at Huntsville in June '87. If you mentioned Apollo and the Saturn V, his eyes lit up when you asked that question. I will miss the opportunity to listen to his stories of the rocket program and of his life in Germany prior to his relocation to the US as a part of Operation Paperclip.
