Why the heck are you so defensive?

For the record, I never said you were a traitor, dude. I only said if you were alluding to a top-secret aircraft like the alleged Aurora aircraft, you'd be a traitor – so that COULDN'T be it!

SO, we're stuck with two other possibilities, the aircraft I suggested, and the space shuttle which I didn't think to include because it flies mainly on orbit and that would be way cooler than flying at Mach 5 and 300,000 ft.

I tried to explain to you once before that the Usenet is not an 'appeal to authority' medium. That is because it is so easy for people to use disguise on it. This does not take away, however, from the Usenet's efficacy in distributing new ideas and for immediate feedback on one's ideas.

Therefore, I am not attempting to 'sell' myself as even so much as a pilot, though I did fly military aircraft prior to retirement. I simply conjure up 'new' ideas that should enable man to open Outer Space up.

Look, let's do a little 'thought experiment'.

Take 4 SRB's and strap a small cockpit to it. Would this achieve LEO. Of course. It would not, however, accomplish much except prove that SSTO is possible.

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Now, take 4 SRB's and put in a center section with 4 SSMEs on it and necessary hydrogen and oxygen. Then put a small cockpit on that. The SSMEs would generate about 1.6 million pounds of thrust. The 4 SRBs would generate 12 million pounds of thrust. The 4 SRBs weight 4 million pounds. The center section would weigh about 1.6 million pounds. Total GLOW would be about 6 million pounds with 13.6 million pounds of thrust.

Now instead of a simple SSTO you have the ability to rendezvous, alter orbit, and retrofire to a safe capsule return.

Now, use a combination of SRBs and SSMEs, a waverider body for HTOL (Horizontal Take Off and Land) and SSTO is a 'piece of cake'.

Remember that an SRB is basically a single stage Minuteman Missile and that is capable of taking a light load into LEO. The SSMEs give you maneuverability and retrofire capability. The waverider will do a 'planetfall' and land like the shuttle.

Once the primary math figures are in place you can jockey them around until you have the right combination of SRBs and SSMEs for a 250,000 pound cargo load.

Now, that wasn't difficult, was it?
