Short answer, it can't. If it could be
disassembled into
much smaller pieces, the most important
parts might be
returnable in Soyuz or Orion--maybe.

Potentially an aeroshell could do the job, but
it'd be
expensive and there's not much demand for
such a service
at present. The capability wasn't used all that
much with
Shuttle, other than SpaceHabs. If a demand
develops, I
suppose a capability will be developed, if
only as a
cargo-only version of Orion or something
similar.

We're going to miss Shuttle's capabilities, on
occasion.
