Hey everyone, I'm posting this topic regarding a very cool award-winning series of interactive elearning modules called Adventures in Statistics.

Designed as a supplementary resource, these modules utilize humor, cartoons, and engaging storylines to reduce student anxiety and maximize understanding of topics covered in introductory statistics courses. Research has shown that humor can combat the anxiety that often leads to academic disengagement (Berk, 1996).

This interactive CD-ROM supplement is available for \$24.95 and was developed with faculty at Columbia University, Fordham University, and City University of New York with the goal of exploring ways in which technology can enhance students' learning experiences.

Comprised of five fun, cartoon-based modules (each 10 to 15 minutes long), this series covers topics such as normal distributions, confidence intervals, the chi-square contingency test, and the test of two means. Each module also includes a study guide, assessment quizzes, and interactive exercises.
